English Preparatory Program

Educational Philosophy

At Istanbul Nişantaşı University's Foreign Languages Department, we believe language learning is a transformative journey that opens doors to academic success, career growth, and meaningful global connections. We are dedicated to creating an inclusive and supportive environment where students develop the skills and confidence to thrive in an ever-changing world.

Our approach focuses on hands-on, student-centered learning, blending innovative methods with the latest technology. We aim to help students think critically, communicate effectively, and adapt to new challenges, while also supporting our teachers' growth to ensure a high-quality learning experience.

We celebrate diversity and foster a strong sense of community, where everyone feels valued and empowered to contribute to a sustainable and equitable future. At our core, we are committed to inspiring lifelong learning and preparing students to excel in a multilingual, interconnected world.

Educational Program

Our English Preparatory Program is structured around the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), which helps classify language proficiency. The program consists of four levels: Foundation, B1, B1+, and B2. Each level is designed to build on the previous one, ensuring students receive tailored instruction that supports their progression in language skills.

At the beginning of the fall semester, students take İstanbul Nişantaşı University (NUEPT), which consists of two sections, to assess their proficiency levels. The results of Section 1—which covers grammar, vocabulary, listening, and reading—are used as **the placement test** for students who do not pass it, ensuring they are placed in the appropriate level within the English preparatory program. Students who do not take the test at all are automatically placed in Foundation Level.

Levels Overview

Foundation

Duration: 9 weeks

Class Hours: 25 hours per week, 225 hours in total

In the Foundation module, students are introduced to the foundations of English, enabling them to engage in simple interactions and develop confidence in using the language. Instruction emphasizes interactive, project-based learning and supports the development of critical thinking through the integration of educational technology.



B1

Duration: 9 weeks

Class Hours: 25 hours per week, 225 hours in

total

In the B1 module, students increase their autonomy and are prepared to handle a variety of real-life situations more confidently. Language learning is integrated with analytical thinking, reflective practice, and technology-rich projects that simulate academic and professional contexts.

B1+

Duration: 9 weeks

Class Hours: 25 hours per week, 225 hours in

total

In the B1+ module, students strengthen their fluency and accuracy while engaging in collaborative tasks, intercultural learning, and independent study strategies. They learn to express opinions in greater detail, interpret texts more critically, and produce clear written work, preparing them for more advanced academic challenges.

B2

Duration: 9 weeks

Class Hours: 25 hours per week, 225 hours in

total

At the B2 level, students refine their fluency and accuracy, enabling them to engage in complex discussions and academic tasks with greater spontaneity. This module supports advanced project-based work, promotes intercultural awareness, and emphasizes sustainable and responsible communication practices.

Prof Class

Duration: 9 Weeks

Class Hours: 135 hours in total

Prof modules are designed for students who have successfully completed the B2 level but have not yet achieved a passing score on the Nişantaşı University English Proficiency Test (NUEPT). These courses focus on consolidating academic skills and refining language accuracy, with intensive exam practice across reading, listening, speaking, and writing. Special emphasis is placed on exam strategies, critical analysis, and clear academic communication. Attendance is mandatory, and active participation is expected to maximize exam readiness.

Modular System

The English Preparatory Program follows a modular system, with each module corresponding to a specific language proficiency level based on the CEFR framework. Each module lasts 9 weeks, allowing students to focus intensively on their language development.

Students are assessed through various components, including online assignments, projects, participation, and Mid-Level Progress Test and final exams. To successfully progress to the next module, students must achieve the required success grade based on their performance.

For most students, a module success score of 60 points or above is required to move on to the next module. However, students in certain undergraduate programs, such as English Language and Literature, English Translation and Interpreting, must achieve a module success score of 75 points or above to progress.

This structure ensures steady, measurable advancement in language skills throughout the preparatory program, with students gradually building their proficiency and academic readiness in English.

Coursebooks

The English Preparatory Program uses levelspecific coursebooks to support skill development and academic readiness. Students are expected to purchase their books from the campus bookstore at the beginning of the academic year.

Assessment and Evaluation

Each module includes a variety of assessments to evaluate students' understanding and progress. The assessment components for each module are as follows:

Mid-Level Progress Test (20%): The Mid-Level Progress test in Istanbul Nişantaşı University Preparatory English course is a comprehensive assessment that evaluates students' understanding and mastery of key language skills and concepts covered in the first half of the module. This exam typically assesses listening and reading comprehension, writing proficiency, vocabulary acquisition, and grammar knowledge. Mid-Level Progress Test score contributes 20% to the students' total score.

End-of-the-Module Test (40%): This test in Istanbul Nişantaşı University Preparatory English course is a summative assessment conducted at the end of the course. It evaluates students' overall proficiency in English, including their listening and reading comprehension, writing and speaking proficiency, vocabulary acquisition, and grammar knowledge. The final exam encompasses all course content. Final exam score contributes 40% to the students' total score.

Project (10%): Each module includes the following project components: two Speaking Tasks, two Writing Tasks, and one Presentation. These tasks are designed to support students' development of academic communication skills in both spoken and written forms.

-Speaking Tasks (3%)

Students are required to complete two speaking tasks per module. These in-class tasks aim to assess the ability to communicate ideas clearly, fluently, and appropriately. Topics and instructions will be provided by the course instructors.

-Writing Tasks (3%)

Each module includes two writing tasks, one of which will be directly related to the presentation topic. Instructors will provide detailed guidance on task requirements, including content and structure.

-Presentation (4%)

Students will prepare and deliver one presentation per module. Presentation topics will be assigned by the instructors. Students are expected to create a visual presentation using slides and present their work in class according to a schedule shared in advance. Presentation criteria and expectations will also be provided by the instructors.

Participation (10%): Each module also includes a Participation grade, which is based on students' involvement in class activities and discussions. This includes attendance, active engagement, use of English, preparation, respectful behavior, and consistent effort. The Participation component is designed to support students' language development and overall engagement with the learning process.

Online Assignments (20%): Each module includes an Online Assignments component, which accounts for 20% of the final grade. Tasks are completed through platforms such as Cambridge One, Macmillan Skillful, and Sensations English, and are designed to support students' independent study habits and reinforce classroom learning. These assignments offer consistent practice, immediate feedback, and a variety of learning activities that complement inclass instruction.

In our Foreign Languages Department, online assignments are considered an essential part of your coursework. Each of the three platforms contributes to a well-rounded language learning experience:

Cambridge One provides a personalized learning experience with adaptive exercises and instant feedback, helping students build on strengths and target areas for improvement.

Using these platforms effectively helps students stay organized, meet deadlines, and make steady progress in their language development throughout the module.

Attendance Requirements

Students must attend at least 80% of their classes to successfully pass a level. It is the student's responsibility to monitor their own attendance throughout the module. While you can check your attendance status on the OBIS system, please note that the records may not always be instantly updated.

If a student misses more than 20% of their classes, they will be required to repeat the level. For students at the B2 level, exceeding this absence limit will also mean they are not eligible to take the Nişantaşı University English Proficiency Test (NUEPT).

Late Arrival Policy

If you arrive more than 5 minutes late or leave before the class ends, you will be marked absent for that session. Please make sure to attend your classes on time and stay until the end.

Excuses for Missing Class

Medical reports, health-related absences, family obligations, and part-time job commitments are not accepted as valid excuses for absence.

However, in exceptional cases such as:

- Serious or chronic illnesses (with official documentation covering 5 or consecutive days.)
- The loss of a parent or sibling (with proof)

You may contact the Foreign Languages Department and submit a petition. These cases will be reviewed individually, and you will receive a response within 10 working days.

İstanbul Nişantaşı University English Proficiency Test (NUEPT)

Eligibility Requirements

For Mandatory English Preparatory Program Students at the Beginning of the Academic Year:

Students enrolled in the Mandatory English Preparatory Program take NUEPT at the beginning of their first academic year. Based on their test results:

- Students who achieve the required passing score are exempted from the English Preparatory Program.
- Students who do not meet the exemption criteria are placed in a preparatory class at an appropriate level.

For Voluntary English Preparatory Program Students at the Beginning of the Academic Year:

Students in the Voluntary English Preparatory Program take the first part of the NUEPT as a placement test to determine their starting level.

Eligibility for B2 Level Students during the Academic Year:

At the end of the each term, all students who successfully complete the B2 level are eligible to take NUEPT.

Academic Performance-Based Eligibility for Lower Levels during the Academic Year:

Additionally, students from lower levels may qualify to take NUEPT based on their academic performance:

- B1+ students with a 90+ average in the Mid-Level Progress Test and Final Exams at the end of Module 2 or Module 4
- B1 students with a 95+ average in the Mid-Level Progress Test and Final Exams at the end of Module 2 or Module 4

Eligibility for Prof Class Students during the Academic Year:

At the end of the 1st and 3rd modules, all students who have completed the B2 level but have not yet passed the Nişantaşı University English Proficiency Test (NUEPT), including those from previous academic years who did not successfully complete the Prof Class, are required to study in the Prof Class. Students who successfully complete the Prof Class become eligible to retake the NUEPT. Attendance is mandatory.

Test Results and Department Requirements

Students who pass NUEPT with the required score can begin their academic studies in their respective departments. Passing scores vary by department:

- 75 English Language and Literature, and Translation & Interpreting Students
- 60 for all other departments

The list of eligible students for NUEPT are announced on our website. Please check the announcements section for updates.

NUEPT Content and Scoring

NUEPT consists of two sections.

NUEPT Section 1

NUEPT Section 1 includes four parts: Listening, Vocabulary, Grammar and Reading. Students who pass NUEPT Section 1 are allowed to take NUEPT Section 2 and those who cannot pass will be placed in our English Preparatory Program classes according to their test result.

Listening part consists of two sets of questions and each set includes 5 multiplechoice questions. The recordings are played only once. Students are given 30 seconds to read the questions before the recording starts for each set and then they have to answer the questions while they are listening. At the end, the students are given one minute to check their answers.

Vocabulary part includes 10 multiple-choice questions, which assess students' word knowledge. It measures their ability to recognize vocabulary in context, ensuring they can apply words accurately in various situations. This part is designed to test students' knowledge of both common and academic vocabulary.

Grammar part includes 10 multiple-choice questions which evaluates students' understanding of key grammatical concepts and structures in English. It tests students' ability to apply correct grammar in different contexts, focusing on areas such as sentence structure and verb tenses. The questions are designed to assess students' grammatical accuracy, helping us determine their proficiency level and ensuring appropriate placement in our program.

Reading Comprehension part consists of two reading passages. Each followed by 5 multiple-choice questions. Reading comprehension questions assess a student's ability to understand and analyse written texts, extract essential information, and identify main ideas and overall meaning.

NUEPT Section 2

Students who achieve a sufficient score in NUEPT Section 1 are eligible to take NUEPT Section 2.

NUEPT Section 2 includes Writing and Speaking.

Writing includes an essay. Students are required to write an essay of at least 220 words. They are given two topics to choose from and must develop their ideas clearly and comprehensively. The time allotted for this section is 40 minutes. Essays are assessed based on grammar, vocabulary, coherence and cohesion, and task response; and are evaluated by two examiners to ensure accuracy and fairness.

Speaking lasts 7 to 10 minutes, during which students are asked 2-3 personal questions and 2-3 general questions. They are expected to respond clearly and confidently, demonstrating their ability to express their ideas in English. This part is recorded during the exam and responses are assessed based on grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and fluency

NUEPT Regulations

These regulations have been designed to ensure fairness and a smooth test process for everyone.

Arrival Time

- Students must be in the exam classroom at least 30 minutes before the announced exam time.
- No students will be permitted to enter the classroom after the exam has begun.

Identification

- Students are required to present their Student ID Card.
- Students without proper identification will not be allowed to take the exam.

Test Classroom

- Exams will take place in the classrooms listed in the Schedule announced before the exam.
- To find your assigned classroom, please refer to the test list posted on the website. If you are unable to locate your classroom, visit the Foreign Languages Department for assistance at least two days before the exam.

Electronic Devices

• The use of mobile phones and other electronic devices is strictly prohibited in the exam room. All electronic devices must be turned off and handed in before the exam begins. Invigilators will collect the devices and conduct checks to ensure full compliance.

Answer Sheets

- Students must use a pencil to mark their answers on the optical answer sheet.
- Answers that are not transferred to the answer sheet will be considered invalid.
- No extra time will be given for transferring answers.
- At the end of the exam, please double-check to ensure that all your answers have been correctly transferred to the answer sheet.

Disciplinary Policy

- Exam questions or answers to them cannot be written on paper and taken out of the exam hall. All actions to this end will be considered attempts to cheat.
- Students who cheat, attempt to cheat or help others do so are determined by way of a written report and subjected to a disciplinary proceeding.

Classroom Policies and Expectations

Student Discipline Regulations

YÖK Student Discipline Regulation (Öğrenci Disiplin Yönergesi) outlines the behaviours students are expected to exhibit to maintain order and discipline within higher education institutions. It also details the penalties for violations of these rules, ensuring a fair and orderly academic environment.

The regulation includes provisions against actions such as attempting to cheat during exams or allowing others to use personal student ID cards, which can lead to disciplinary investigations.

We encourage all students to review this regulation carefully to understand their responsibilities and the consequences of any violations. By adhering to these rules, you contribute to a respectful and fair academic community.

Use of English in the Classroom

English (or the target language) should be the primary language for classroom activities to promote language immersion. Students are encouraged to practice their language skills as much as possible.

Participation and Engagement Rules

Active participation is vital for language acquisition and academic success. Students are expected to engage in discussions, ask questions, and contribute to group activities. Participation is part of the evaluation criteria.

Academic Honesty and Plagiarism Policy

Academic integrity is crucial at Istanbul Nişantaşı University. Plagiarism or cheating will result in serious consequences, including receiving a grade of 0 for the assignment or exam and potential disciplinary action. All assignments are checked for plagiarism using specialized tools, and students must properly acknowledge all sources, including Al-generated content.

Al technologies can enhance learning but must be used in alignment with academic integrity and transparency.

Guidelines for Responsible Al Use:

- Transparency: Indicate when AI tools are used in your work, specifying which tools and for what purposes.
- Ownership: Ensure that the ideas presented are your own; Al-generated content should support your contributions.
- Plagiarism Prevention: Avoid presenting Algenerated content as your own.
 Misrepresentation may lead to academic misconduct.
- Data Privacy: Do not share personal or sensitive data with Al systems unless necessary and anonymized.
- Critical Evaluation: Review Al-generated content for accuracy and relevance before submission.

Violations of these principles may result in disciplinary actions as per university regulations. For further ethical guidelines, visit the Foreign Languages Department's website.



Student Support & Resources

Library

Istanbul Nişantaşı University Library provides a wide range of resources and modern facilities to support your educational and teaching activities. With a diverse collection that includes books, journals, digital materials, and various learning resources, the library is designed to meet the needs of all students. We have implemented arrangements to ensure easy access to library services for every student.

To enhance your learning experience, our library features various individual study areas. As natural members of the library, students can take full advantage of these facilities, making their research and study processes more efficient.

Library Borrowing and Usage Guidelines

- Undergraduate and associate degree students can borrow up to 3 items for 15 days and request a onetime 7-day extension.
- Master's and doctoral students are allowed to borrow up to 4 items for 21 days and may request a one-time 7-day extension.

- Faculty members can borrow up to 5 items for 30 days and request a one-time 15-day extension.
- A late fee will be charged for overdue items. For lost or damaged books, users must replace the book with an identical copy or pay a fine.
- Food and drinks (except water) are not allowed in the library.
- Loud conversations and disruptive behavior that may disturb others are prohibited.

• Weekdays: 08:30 - 21:00

• During exam periods: Extended hours until 22:00

Health Services

Our infirmary operates full-time with doctors and nurses to ensure the well-being of our students. As part of our health measures, medical screenings and preventive informational sessions are organized throughout the year. Additionally, we collaborate with various institutions and organizations on projects aimed at promoting student health.



Psychological Counseling Services

At our Psychological Counseling Unit, students receive a Bio-Psycho-Social assessment to ensure comprehensive support:

- Biological Assessment: Identifies any hereditary psychological conditions and refers students to a psychiatrist if necessary.
- Psychological Assessment: Evaluates coping strategies, social relationships, and overall mental well-being through clinical observation and, when needed, standardized assessment tools.
- Social Assessment: Examines students' relationships with their counselor, family, and peers.

Our unit has two clinical psychologists, and sessions are held once a week, lasting 45 minutes each. These sessions are free of charge.

Who Can Benefit?

Psychological counseling services are available to undergraduate, master's, and doctoral students.

Complaint and Grievance Policy

The Foreign Languages Department is committed to ensuring that all students have access to a fair, respectful, and supportive educational environment. While we aim to prevent problems before they arise, we recognize that students may sometimes face academic or personal concerns that require formal attention.

Students may file formal complaints related to academic issues such as curriculum implementation, use of materials, or instructor-related concerns including poor communication or rapport. Complaints regarding harassment or discrimination are taken seriously and will be handled with strict confidentiality and care, as we strive to maintain a safe and equitable learning space.

We encourage students to first try to resolve academic issues by speaking directly with their instructor, academic advisor, or a member of the administrative team. However, if the issue remains unresolved or is considered too serious for informal discussion, students should submit a Student Complaint Form and follow the Formal Complaint Procedures outlined below.

Formal Complaint Procedures

Deadlines for Filing a Complaint: Complaints must be submitted within 15 working days of the occurrence of the issue. If a student misses the deadline without a valid reason and supporting documentation, the complaint will not be processed. If the delay is due to a valid reason, the department will assess its credibility and inform the student of the outcome. If the department fails to meet a deadline, the student may refer the matter to the Dean of Students Office, which serves as a mediator between students and academic departments at ogrenci.dekanligi@nisantasi.edu.tr

Filing a Complaint: Students must complete <u>istanbul</u> <u>Nişantaşı University Help Form</u>, available on the department website, and submit it with any supporting documents.



Review and Initial Response: The Foreign Languages Department will acknowledge and begin processing the complaint within 5 working days. The response will be delivered to the student through the same online system where the complaint was submitted.

Evaluation and Decision: All complaints are initially reviewed by the Administrative Coordinator. Valid complaints are then forwarded to the Student Grievance Committee, which consists of:

- The Head of the Foreign Languages Department
- The Administrative Coordinator
- · A Testing Specialist from the Testing and Assessment Unit

The committee reviews the case, discusses potential solutions, and issues a decision. Meeting notes and decisions are documented and recorded by the administrative coordinator. The final outcome is communicated to the student via the online complaint system.

If a student is not satisfied with the outcome, they may request a reevaluation of the complaint. If the issue remains unresolved after reevaluation, the student has the right to request a further review by the Dean of Students Office.

Open Door Hour Events: In addition to formal procedures, the Foreign Languages Department holds Open Door Hour every Wednesday from 13:00 to 14:00 in Classroom C166. These informal sessions give students the chance to share feedback or concerns directly with department leadership. Attendees include the Head of Department, Academic and Administrative Coordinators, Management Team, volunteer instructors, and class representatives. All students are welcome to join and support the continuous improvement of the program.

Personal Data Protection and Processing at Istanbul Nişantaşı University

At Istanbul Nişantaşı University, we prioritize the privacy and security of personal data in compliance with Personal Data Protection Law No. 6698 (KVKK). This law safeguards individuals' fundamental rights and freedoms, particularly the right to privacy, during the processing of personal data. It also defines the responsibilities, principles, and procedures for collecting, storing, and managing personal data.

How Your Data is Processed

Personal data includes any information that identifies you, such as data collected during registration, academic activities, and other university interactions. This data may be processed using automated or manual methods as part of a data recording system. Processing includes obtaining, recording, storing, modifying, transferring, and securely disposing of data as required.

Purpose of Processing

Your personal data is processed at Istanbul Nişantaşı University to:

- Facilitate educational and academic activities in accordance with the Yükseköğretim Kanunu (Higher Education Law) and related regulations.
- Manage student records, including registrations, payments, and academic progress.
- · Ensure legal and institutional compliance with labor, health, safety, and financial regulations.
- Personalize educational services based on student needs and preferences.
- · Maintain campus security and provide administrative support for academic and extracurricular activities.

Your Rights as a Data Subject

As a student, you have the right to:

- Inquire whether your personal data is being processed.
- Access your processed data and request information about its use.
- Learn the purpose of data processing and ensure it is applied correctly.
- Identify third parties to whom your data has been transferred, locally or internationally.
- Request corrections if your personal data is incomplete or incorrect.
- Request the deletion or destruction of your personal data under legal conditions.
- Object to automated decisions that may negatively affect you.
- Seek compensation if your data has been unlawfully processed.

Some students will also be chosen, both during the program and after they enter their departments, to take a Needs Analysis Survey to help us determine if students feel prepared for their English medium departments and to see if there are any changes we should make to our program.

For which departments is the English Preparatory Program mandatory?

English Preparatory Program is mandatory for students enrolled in departments where the medium of instruction is 100% English, provided they fail the İstanbul Nişantaşı University English Proficiency Test (NUEPT).

2

If my department is in Turkish, can I voluntarily enroll in the Preparatory Program?

Yes. Our university offers optional preparatory education to students.

Preparatory Program Exemption Conditions

How can I be exempted from the preparatory Program?

Students who pass the required score in the Istanbul Nişantaşı University English Proficiency Exam (NUEPT) are exempt from the Preparatory Program. The passing score for the Departments of English Language and Literature and English Translation and Interpreting is 75; for all other departments, it is 60.



Which national and/or international exams can I take to be exempted from the preparatory class?

Accepted exams and their validity periods are as follows (except English Language and Literature, English Translation and Interpreting :

I have an external English proficiency certificate. How can I apply for exemption?

Students wishing to be exempt from the Preparatory Program must submit the Preparatory Program Exemption Application Form and valid exam documents in person to the Secretariat of the Foreign Languages Department. If there is any doubt about the validity of the documents or the student's English level, the department may request verification information or administer an additional assessment exam. The result of this exam will determine the outcome of the exemption request.

I have a document proving that I studied in the English Preparatory Program at another university. Can I be exempt?

Yes. Students who have studied in a 100% English-medium program at another higher education institution within the last three years and have passed that institution's proficiency exam can apply for exemption by submitting valid documents to the Foreign Languages Department.

I have a document proving that I studied in the English Preparatory Program at another university, but there was no proficiency exam at the end. Can I be exempt?

If you can prove that no English Proficiency Exam was held at the end of the preparatory program and you have met the requirements to successfully complete your university's preparatory program, you may be exempt from the Preparatory Program at Istanbul Nişantaşı University.

I am currently studying in a 100% English-medium department and plan to transfer to an English-medium department at your university. Can I be exempt?

Yes, if you can provide valid proof of this, you may be exempt. Your documents will be reviewed for validity, and if necessary, an interview or additional assessment exam may be administered.

I graduated from a 100% English-medium department and want to pursue an English-medium master's or doctoral program at your university. Can I be exempt?

Yes. Students who have graduated within the last three years from a 100% English-medium program at another higher education institution may apply for exemption by submitting valid documents to the Foreign Languages Department.

I am a citizen of a country where English is the official language. How can I apply for exemption?

Students who have completed the last three years of their education entirely in English at a secondary school in a country where English is the official language may apply for exemption by providing a diploma and transcript as proof. If the documents are deemed insufficient, an additional assessment exam may be administered.

Who will review my exemption application?

A three-person English Preparatory Program Exemption Commission is established in the Department of Foreign Languages to review the exemption applications of students who meet the exemption requirements. This committee meets regularly and reviews al exemption applications and decides on the applications by majority vote.



I submitted my documents showing that I meet the exemption requirements. Why was my application rejected?

According to the regulations of the Foreign Languages Department, submitting documents alone is not sufficient. First, the documents are reviewed for validity. Once their authenticity is confirmed, the student is invited for a short interview. If the student's English proficiency is consistent with the submitted documents, the committee grants exemption. If the student's proficiency is deemed insufficient in the interview, they take a 30-minute assessment exam. Students who fail this exam are directed to take NUEPT.

Istanbul Nişantaşı University Proficiency Test (NUEPT)

What is the difference between the Istanbul Nişantaşı University English Proficiency
Test (NUEPT) and the Placement Test?

The NUEPT is an examination that students enrolled in English departments must take to
demonstrate their English proficiency before beginning their studies. The Placement

The NUEPT is an examination that students enrolled in English departments must take to demonstrate their English proficiency before beginning their studies. The Placement Test, on the other hand, determines the level of classes for students who study English voluntarily.

What conditions must I meet to take the Proficiency Test (NUEPT)?

All students in the English Preparatory Program may take the first NUEPT at the beginning of the academic year without conditions.

During the semester, eligibility is limited to: Students who successfully complete the B2 level at the end of Module 2 or 4, students who previously completed B2 but failed NUEPT (must complete one more module before retaking), B1+ students in Module 2 or 4 with a Mid-Level Progress Test-final average of 90+, B1 students in Module 2 or 4 with a Mid-Level Progress Test-final average of 95+.

Is it mandatory to take the Proficiency Test (NUEPT)?

No, taking the test is not mandatory. If a student does not take the test, they will begin their education at the Foundation level.

Can I take the Proficiency Test (NUEPT) at another time?

No. NUEPT is only held on the official dates in the academic calendar. Students must take it in the semester they are eligible. There are no make-up exams. Exceptions may be made for transfer students or international students.

What happens if I fail the Proficiency Test (NUEPT)?

If you fail, you will be placed into Foundation, B1, B1+, or B2 depending on your score, and you will continue with the Preparatory Program.

Can I get the exam booklet or answer key after the test?

No. The exam questions and answer keys are not shared with students.

Where can I see the exam format and sample questions?

The content, structure, and sample questions are available on the Foreign Languages Department's website. (Click here for the link.)

I successfully finished B2. Can I take NUEPT?

Yes, if you complete B2 at the end of the 2nd or 4th module, you can take the NUEPT at mid-year or end of the academic year. If you finish B2 at the end of the 1st or 3rd module, you must first complete and pass the Prof Class module.

I completed B2 at the end of the 2nd module but failed the NUEPT. What happens next?

If you pass B2 but fail NUEPT, you must continue in the Prof Class in the following module.

What is Prof Class and how am I assessed?

Prof Class helps students prepare for NUEPT through targeted practice and examstyle tasks. Assessment is based on Participation (40%), Quizzes (40%), and In-Class Tasks (20%). Attendance is compulsory (minimum 80% required).

Class Schedule and Attendance

How many days a week will I have classes?

The English Preparatory Program is planned

The English Preparatory Program is planned for five days a week and delivered face-to-face at the NeoTech Campus. The weekly class load is 25 hours.

What are the teachers' office hours and how can I meet them?

Office hours are announced at the beginning of each module. You may visit during those hours without an appointment, or you can request a meeting by email.

Is attendance mandatory?

Yes. Students must attend at least 80% of their classes. Those who fail to meet this requirement are considered unsuccessful at their current level, even if they perform well academically.

How can I check my absences?
You can track your attendance records through the digital attendance system and OBIS.

How is my class schedule determined?

Classes are scheduled in morning or afternoon shifts, and students are placed into a shift according to logistical planning and class balance.

Can I choose my own class time?
Changes to class schedules are only possible with a valid reason. You must submit a petition with official documents (such as an SGK report or a medical certificate) to the Foreign Languages Department during the first week of the module.

Can I use medical reports to excuse absences?

Medical reports do not automatically reduce absences. However, the following may be considered if submitted with a petition:

- Reports covering at least 5 days
- Reports related to serious or chronic health conditions
- Documentation of the death of a first-degree relative

Applications must be submitted to the Foreign Languages Department and will be reviewed within 10 days.

How can I check how many hours of absenteeism I have?

Monitoring attendance is primarily the student's responsibility. In special cases, students can discuss their attendance with their main teachers.

How can I submit a petition?

How many hours of absence am I allowed?

Your absence limit depends on the length of the module and the weekly class hours. Each module is 9 weeks long with 25 hours per week, for a total of about 225 hours. The 20% absence allowance equals roughly 45 hours per module.

Can I arrive late to class?

Classes begin on time. Students are expected to be punctual.

Mid-Level Progress Test and Final Exams

What happens if I cannot attend the Mid-Level Progress Test/Final Exams?

If you cannot attend a Mid-Level Progress Test or final exam due to a valid excuse, you must submit your supporting documents to the Foreign Languages Department Secretariat within 5 working days along with an online petition. If your excuse is accepted, you will be given the right to take a make-up exam.

Can I see my exam paper afterwards?

Yes. If you want to review your exam after the results are announced, you can do so together with your instructor by visiting the Testing Office of the Foreign Languages Department. A written petition is required.

How can I appeal my exam score?

You must submit a written petition within 5 working days after the results are announced. Your exam will first be checked by your instructor for clerical mistakes. If you are still not satisfied, a three-member committee assigned by the Department will re-evaluate your exam. The final decision will be communicated to you in writing within 10 working days.

Summer School

Do I have to pay for summer school?

Yes. Summer School is optional, and students who choose to attend are required to pay the fee set annually by the Board of Trustees. Please contact the Financial Affairs Office for updated fee details.

Resources and Materials

Is it mandatory to purchase the books?

It is not strictly mandatory to purchase the course books. However, without them you will not have access to the activation codes and online homework platforms. It is also difficult to follow classes without the books. Since online assignments count for 20% of your module grade, getting the books is strongly recommended.


Where do I find my activation code for Cambridge One?

An activation code is a unique string of 16 numbers and letters that can only be activated once. You can find it printed on the inside cover of your Student's Book.

Can I have a Sensations English account if I don't have the books? No, unfortunately, the Sensations English account requires a subscription, which is provided only when students purchase the book packs.

Completing the Preparatory Program

I am enrolled in the optional preparatory program. What happens if I do not complete it successfully?

Students in the optional preparatory program may proceed directly to their department even if they do not successfully complete the program. However, instead of a Preparatory Certificate, they are only given a Statement of Status.

What is a Statement of Status?

The Statement of Status is an official document that provides details about the student's time in the English Preparatory Program, the levels completed, and their NUEPT test status.

If English is compulsory for my program, how do I complete the preparatory year? Students in the compulsory English preparatory program must successfully pass Istanbul Nişantaşı University English Proficiency Test (NUEPT) in order to complete the program. Students become eligible to take this exam after completing the B2 level, or by meeting the required success criteria at B1/B1+ levels.

How can I obtain my Preparatory Certificate or Statement of Status?

You can request it by sending an email to the Foreign Languages Departmental Secretariat: prepenisantasi.edu.tr

The steps for requesting a student certificate are illustrated in Figure 3 at the end.


I have successfully completed the preparatory program. How do I choose courses in my department?

Once you receive your certificate, you should contact your faculty secretary and the Student Affairs Office for guidance on course registration. Course selection is carried out according to the university's academic calendar.

What happens if I cannot successfully complete the English Preparatory Program?

- Optional students: Even if they are unsuccessful, they can move on to their departments, but they cannot receive the "Preparatory Certificate."
- Compulsory students: They cannot proceed to their departments without completing the preparatory program. To do so, they must obtain a passing score on NUEPT.



Student Sends Request via Email

The student sends a certificate request from their university email address to prep@nisantasi.edu.tr.



Secretary Checks Student Status

The secretary reviews the student's academic and administrative status to ensure eligibility for certificate issuance.

If the student is eligible, the secretary prepares the certificate in the approved format.



Head of Department Signs Certificate

The certificate is forwarded to the Head of Department for digital signature and final approval.

The signed certificate is sent to the student's university email address within **10 working days** of the request.
